This fine play - a comedy in Three Acts - tells the story of Robert Burns' love affair with Mrs Maclehose - the "Clarinda" of the Sylvander and Clarinda correspondence, to whom was written one of the great love lyrics of the language "Ac Fond Kiss".

Nancie Maclehose moves from her light headed first meeting with Burns, through the happiness of love, to the bitterness and tragedy of her fate, when Robert Burns suddenly returns to the country and marries Jean Armour. The play also shows the many stresses to which Burns was subject - the conflict between his country background and the intellectual life of Edinburgh, and between the English literature which he was urged to study and imitate, and the appealing old Scots folk songs. All the time, in the background, lingers the image of Jean Armour, the country girl and emblem of the Scottish folk, to whom he would shortly turn.
