Annually we hold a competitive festival for one-act plays which start with festivals in 24 Districts, one of which is held here in Edinburgh. The festivals are professionally judged by an independent adjudicator who will award trophies unique to each district. The winners and runners-up will then represent their districts at Divisional rounds then the winners and runners-up from these four Divisions will represent their Divisions at a Scottish Final. The winners of the Scottish Final go on to compete in a British Final with sister organisations from England, Ireland and Wales.

ABOUT THE CLUB

Leitheatre was founded in 1946 in Kirkgate Church in Leith, Scotland, by a group of people interested in drama, encouraged by the Rev James Scott Marshall.

In 1973 Kirkgate Church was amalgamated with South Leith Church. As a theatre license

could not be obtained for the shared hall, and as the group was no longer affiliated to Kirkgate Church, it was felt a new name was needed - Leitheatre was born, giving us a new identity, but still reflecting our Leith roots.

In 2001 we purchased premises at 22 Sunnyside, off Easter Road in Edinburgh, and has been our home ever since.

We produce 3 full length plays a year, including during the Edinburgh Festival Fringe. We take part in the SCDA One Act Play Festival and have for many years, presented a show, based on the life of Robert Burns, in January each year, to various societies, clubs and care homes.





THE ADJUDICATOR

We are delighted to welcome Kate Stephenson as our festival adjudicator. Kate is an Edinburgh-based arts freelancer working across theatre, heritage and public engagement. She runs her own theatre company which produces traditional texts in new ways as well as telling historical tales of interesting women. Kate has worked throughout the UK and has experience of festivals, touring theatre and site-specific performance. She is also an Edinburgh Fringe veteran, 2024 will be her fifteenth Festival and she has directed, produced and performed in shows as well as running venues in 2019 and 2021.
